Practice Examiner

Essential Requirements

- UK Registered Architect with a minimum of 5 years' continuous professional experience post-registration.
- Have a good range of high quality architectural professional experience with a broad knowledge of practice management, procurement and job administration.
- Have a positive commitment to the maintenance of professional standards in architecture.

Desirable Requirements

• Have acted as an Employment Mentor.

Duties of a Practice Examiner

• To assess candidates in accordance with APEAS systems and processes.

Training and Development

• Practice Examiners are expected to attend the APEAS annual Seminar.

Prior to the Oral Examinations

- Read and apply documentation provided by APEAS that supports the Part 3 Examination process (e.g., Guide for Examiners, Guide for Candidates...)
- Undertake independent initial assessment and grading of candidates' documentary submissions.
- Submit initial grades by the date specified by APEAS.
- Consult with paired Practice Examiner prior to the Oral Examinations to discuss borderline candidates.

At the Oral Examinations

- Participate in the initial meeting of the Practice Examiners' Committee.
- Undertake oral examination interviews with paired Practice Examiner.
- Agree candidate grades with paired Practice Examiner.
- Participate in the Practice Examiners' Committee meeting following the oral examination to present results.
- Complete and submit results documentation.
- Provide feedback to failed candidates and liaise with PSAs as required.

Time commitment involved in being a Practice Examiner

Practice Examiners must attend the two days of the Oral Examinations. Time is required to assess candidate documentary submissions and consult with paired Practice Examiner as appropriate – that will vary from one Practice Examiner to the other but is normally between 35 and 50 hours.

Payment for being a Practice Examiner

A fee will be paid to practice examiners who are selected to participate in the examination process each year. This fee will be set by the Board annually. The current fee is £1,015.

Reasonable expenses incurred while attending the seminar and the Oral Examinations will be reimbursed to include travel and accommodation if required.
